In the event of ambiguity, inconsistency, or a need for further clarification arises regarding what constitutes a violation of the Student Code of Conduct shall make the final determination. Any student or student organization found responsible for misconduct is subject to sanctions.

Section 1: Aiding and/or Inciting

- a. Aiding, abetting, persuading, and/or procuring another person or persons to _____ any act of _____ in the University community or environment is prohibited.
- b. The persuading or aiding of another person to _____ on University premises or at functions sponsored, approved by, or participated in by any member of the University is prohibited.
- c. Gathering or groups of students on or off of the premises in such a manner, which causes _____ to public or private property causes _____ to persons, or _____ with orderly functioning of the University or with the normal flow of traffic or ordinary procedures is prohibited.

Section 2: Violation of Sanction

A violation of sanction is defined as _____ with disciplinary actions as sanctions imposed by a judicial body or judicial administrative officer or staff person.

Failure to comply with the terms and actions of a sanction may require the student to _____ a disciplinary fine in addition to the imposition of _____ sanctions.

Section 3: Distribution of Printed Materials

Distribution of printed material that are _____, _____, _____, _____ explicit, _____, or that _____ of public laws or University regulations is prohibited. Using University resources to illegally distribute _____ material is also prohibited.

Section 4: Failure to Comply

Failure to comply includes but it not limited to:

- a. Failing to _____ to a lawful request by properly identified University Officials or law enforcement officials (including Resident Assistants) in the performance of their duties;
- b. Failing to _____ oneself to University officials when requested;
- c. Failing to comply with any _____ imposed on a person by any Student Conduct body or administrator;
- d. Failing to _____ a building during a fire alarm, drill or when otherwise so ordered by a University official, fire department staff or law official.
- e. _____ from law enforcement or University Officials.
- f. Failing to follow established University _____ or _____.

Section 5: Guest Behavior

Students are _____ for the behavior of their _____ whom they invite to the campus or permit to visit the campus.

- a. If a guest is found to be in violation of the Code of Conduct while in the company of the student host or with the student host's knowledge, _____ will be brought against the _____, as well as against the _____ or the host student _____.
- All guests within the residence halls, whether a student or non-student of the University, _____ by the Student Code of Conduct and the rules and regulations of Student Housing.
- b. Residents will _____ responsibility for their guests/visitors upon the arrival in the residence hall and should _____ their guests/visitors throughout the residence halls at all times.
- c. Any _____ involved in an incident or policy violation will be asked to _____ the residence hall by the housing staff and/or the Albany State University Police Department.

Section 6: Motor Vehicle, Traffic, and Parking Violations

Violations of this section includes but the following is not limited to:

- a. Violations of properly constituted rules and regulations governing the _____ (automobiles, motorcycles, etc.) on University-owned or controlled property or at University sponsored or supervised activities is prohibited.
- b. Driving and parking on _____.
- c. Failure to _____ and _____ regulations is punishable by the University Police Department and/or the Office of Vice President for Student Affairs and Enrollment Management. This includes, but is not limited to, operating or attempting to operate a motor vehicle on campus while under the _____, _____ driving, and _____ in improper zones.

- d. Failure to _____ a vehicle as required by the ASU Police Department; unauthorized use of a _____; operation on the campus of a vehicle in violation of an _____; _____ or _____ violation(s) of the ASU Police Department Rules and Regulations. Moreover, applicable local, state, and federal traffic laws _____. Dangerous _____ is also applicable.

Section 7: Repeat Violations

_____ of published rules and regulations of the University, which _____ indicate an unwillingness or inability to conform to the standards of the University for student life, are prohibited.

Section 8: Solicitation

- a. Unauthorized _____, collection of _____, and _____ on campus or within University buildings is not permitted. This includes but is not limited to use of any residence hall room, building, grounds, or parking lot for _____ of any kind, (i.e. the selling of food, tickets, clothing, jewelry, hair, eye lashes, merchandise, favors, etc.) whatsoever is prohibited.
- b. Students may _____ for promotion companies or business firms which entail solicitation for parties or other unauthorized events or the receiving of business offers or goods on _____.
- c. Students may not solicit on _____ of the University.

Section 9: Unlawful Conduct

Violation of this section includes, but is not limited to, any act that violates a provision of the laws of the _____, the laws of any _____ in which such act occurs, the ordinances of any _____, or other political _____, or the laws of another _____ subdivision thereof in which such act occurs.

Unlawful conduct that is deemed to be a violation of the Student Conduct Code includes, but is no limited to conduct that:

- a. Occurs _____ campus;
- b. Occurs in the context of any event planned, presented, sanctioned, or made available by the _____, any _____ of the University, or any student _____ including while _____;
- c. Occurs at any _____ in which one of the University's teams is participating, home or away including while studying abroad; or
- d. Involves _____ of the University community; or otherwise _____ affects the University.

Section 10: Tobacco

The use of all forms of _____ on property owned, leased, rented or belonging to Albany State University, or in any way used by the University or its affiliates, is expressly _____. "Tobacco Products" is defined as cigarettes, cigars, vapes, pipes, all forms of _____ tobacco, _____ cigarette and any other _____ that use tobacco such as hookahs or simulate the use of tobacco such as electronic cigarettes.

Section 11: Tampering or Destroying of Fire Safety Devices/Safety Procedures

_____ with or _____ of fire safety equipment within the residence halls is prohibited. This equipment includes but is not limited to fire alarm pull stations, fire extinguishers, sprinkler systems, smoke detectors and any other _____ located within the residence halls. The following are also prohibited:

- a. Removing and/or covering smoke _____;
- b. Activating an alarm _____ an emergency situation;
- c. Removing and/or tampering with _____ on fire alarm pull stations;
- d. Removing and/or tampering with common area and room _____ systems;
- e. _____ is a violation and compromises the student safety within the residence halls;
- f. Discharging a _____ for any purpose other than _____; etc.
- g. Propping of _____ such as suite/unit and bedroom doors are also considered a _____;
- h. Tampering with or removing _____ from residence hall windows.

Section 12: Student Organization Misconduct

- a. _____. The student organization did not follow policies and procedures which could have prevented the violation of the Code of Student Conduct;

- b. _____ . The student organization did not take steps to prevent the behavior, did not actively oppose the behavior and/or has a culture of behavior that violates the Code of Student Conduct;
 - c. _____ . The student organization coordinated or was an active player in the violation of the Code of Student Conduct. Conduct outcome(s) assigned to a student organization will be related, in part, to the categories above in which the violation falls.
